- 1. Email the Paralegal Studies Program Director with <u>3</u> writing samples from CSUEB Paralegal Studies coursework already completed or in progress. Each writing sample must be a complete and final work that has already been evaluated and graded by the course instructor.
- 2. In your email, schedule an appointment with the Paralegal Studies Program Director to discuss the writing samples and progress toward program completion by listing 3 days/times you are able to meet.
